
Aim:










Execution of Planned Budget - 95.4%

Comparison of Works Execution








Modernization of E60 and E70 Highways

- Construction for E60-E70 Highways are ongoing for 111 km road section which is 34 km more than the previous year indicator
- ❖ In 2013 the traffic flow was opened for 15.4 new road which is 13.9 km more than the previous 2012 indicator
















Public Procurement

- ❖ In 2013 the number of the participants in the tenders announced by RD increased by 26% compared with last year
- ❖ In 2013 the Bidding Documents were purchased by 187 companies. In 2012 the bidding documents were purchased by 148 companies.

Public Procurement Statistics


Based on the 2013 data of RD, 234 contracts were signed last year using the common electronic system, 13 tenders are ongoing

Roads Rehabilitation Projects

In 2013 rehabilitation has been accomplished for 260 km road sections. 45 bridges, 4 tunnels and 1 snow slide protection structure. 9 new bridges have been constructed under rehabilitation projects.

Rehabilitation of roads and structures have been performed financed by annual Budget of RD, cofinancing from the side of the donors and financial resources of regional funds.

Total of 77.8 km road has been rehabilitated of which:



New Systems for Tunnel Communication Management


















HR Development

Road Worker's Day 2013
























Trend of Highway Construction Activities

- During a period of 2006 2012 total of 68 km highway was opened for traffic.
- ❖ In 2013 15.4km of highway was opened for traffic.
- ❖ In 2014 25km of highway is planned to open for traffic.
- One of the main strategic objectives of the Roads Department is to increase transit competitiveness of E60 and E70 highways.

Roads Department of Georgia will maintain the growing construction trend of the East-West highway.
